This is the task bar on the MS Teams application:





Share

To share your assessment:

- Open the assessment in a new window
- Select 'Share'








Screen sharing a PowerPoint presentation (MS Teams app)

Select 'Share'

Then select 'Window' and the window you want to share



The Scenario Test UK. The scenarios - Power Point




Feature use is limited to cursor movement only. A pop up window will appear so you can see the service user and yourself.








You can share via PowerPoint Live if your assessment is presented on PowerPoint



When using PowerPoint Live, you can use 'Annotate' features to show where you are pointing









Three useful features are Cursor, Pen and Laser Pointer.

1. Cursor



2. Pen



3. Laser pointer: disappears after 2 seconds



These features can be used to point. This facilitates pointing gesture required in this assessment.









Screen sharing a Webpage (MS Teams app)

Select 'Share'

Then select 'Window' and the window you want to share





You cannot annotate when sharing your window.








Screen sharing when joining from a web browser


If you are joining a meeting from a browser, you have the option to share a tab.

Share content





This reduces distractions on the screen.










You cannot annotate when screen sharing windows or tabs.
